Certificate in Business Continuity and Project Management

Programme aim:

This module aims to equip learners with tools and techniques to define business continuity requirements for an organisation and to develop a Business Continuity Strategy.

This module also teaches the principles of effective project management and how these principles can be applied to developing and testing business continuity plans within an organisation.

Successful completion of this course will enable learners to manage business continuity projects in addition to projects in their own area of specialisation.





On successful completion of this course learners should be able to:

- Identify and implement the main elements of business continuity planning along with the tools to define requirements and develop a Business Continuity Strategy (BCS).
- Evaluate and implement a range of project management tools and techniques to initiate, plan, execute, monitor, control and close a business continuity plan project, or other project.
- Critically analyse the role of business continuity planning in a progressive business environment in order to instill resilience in both human and business systems.
- Evaluate and apply schedule development tools and techniques to produce a GANTT chart for a business continuity plan project or other project.
